SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 Suitable (and unsuitable) extinguishing media

Suitable extinguishing media: Dry powder. Foam. Carbon dioxide. Sand.

5.2 Specific hazards arising from the chemical

5.3 Special protective equipment and precautions for fire-fighters

Firefighting instructions: Use cold water spray to cool fire-exposed containers to minimize risk of rupture. Exercise

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment, and emergency procedures

General measures: Evacuate area. Ventilate area. Keep upwind. Spill should be handled by trained cleaning

personnel properly equipped with respiratory and eye protection.

6.1.1 For non-emergency personnel

6.2 Environmental precautions

6.3 Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

For containment/cleaning up:

SMALL SPILL: Dike area to contain spill. Take precautions as necessary to prevent contamination of ground and surface waters. Recover spilled material on absorbent, such as sawdust or vermiculite and sweep into closed containers for disposal. After all visible traces, including ignitable vapors, have been removed, thoroughly wet vacuum the area. Do not flush the sewer. If area of spill is porous, remove as much contaminated earth and gravel, etc. as necessary and place in closed containers for disposal. Only those persons who are adequately trained, authorized, and wearing the required personal protective equipment (PPE) should participate in spill response and clean-up.

Or, absorb spilled product using sawdust or other absorbent. Shovel or sweep into an open top container with a loosely fitted lid. Do not pressurize the container. Transport waste container to a well-ventilated area, preferably outside. If available, treat the spilled area with neutralize solution consisting a mixture of 90% water, 8% Concentrated Ammonium Hydroxide or Sodium Carbonate, and 2% liquid detergent. If solution is not available, wipe off traces of material with a rag. Do not allow spilled material into the sewer.

LARGE SPILL: Keep spectators away. Only those persons who are adequately trained, authorized and wearing the required personal protective equipment (PPE) should participate in spill response and clean-up. Ventilate the area by natural means or by explosion-proof means (i.e., fans). Know and prepare for spill response before using or handling this product. Eliminate all ignition sources (flames, hot surfaces, portable heaters, and sources of electrical, static, or frictional sparks). Dike and contain spill with inert material (e.g., sand, earth). Transfer liquids to covered and labeled metal containers for recovery or disposal or remove them with inert absorbent. Use only non-sparking tools and appropriate PPE. Place absorbent diking materials in covered metal containers for disposal. Prevent contamination of sewers, streams, and groundwater with spilled material or used absorbent.

SECTION 7: HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1 Precautions for safe handling

Precautions for safe handling:

Do not handle until all safety precautions have been read and understood. For professional or industrial use only. Follow label instructions. Keep out of reach of children. Not for consumption. No smoking. Do not breathe vapors. Avoid contact with body. Turn off all pilot lights, flames, stoves, heaters, electric motors, welding equipment and other sources of ignition. Empty containers must not be washed and re-used for any purpose. Contact lens wearers must wear protective eye wear around chemical vapors and liquid. Wash hands thoroughly after handling.
